The American Association of University Women (AAUW) is a nonpartisan, nonprofit organization that serves as the nation's leading voice promoting equity and education for women and girls. Since its founding in 1881, AAUW members have examined and taken positions on the fundamental issues of the day — educational, social, economic, and political.

Shoreline AAUW is a local AAUW branch that was established in 1951 and currently has about 75 members with the majority living between Branford and Westbrook. We are an active group of diverse ages, backgrounds, and interests. Some are retirees, others are still working, and all are friendly, intellectually and culturally active, and interested in women's issues and advocacy.

What Our Dues Support ...

AAUW National Educational Assistance and Legal Advocacy Programs. AAUW is one of the world's largest sources of funding for graduate women; this year AAUW is providing more than \$3.7 million in fellowships and grants. AAUW's Legal Advocacy Fund provides resources to combat sex discrimination in higher education and workplaces.

Local Branch Scholarships. We give an annual \$2,000 tuition-assistance scholarship to a local woman for undergraduate or graduate studies. We also award one or more scholarships to undergraduate women to attend the annual National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL) at the University of Maryland.
